

Seven Dials Mystery

Prize: A Colin Dexter Morse book signed by 'Inspector Morse'. Closes 01.12.2013

Solutions run in three directions. Circular solutions run in a clockwise direction on the outside of dials. Diametric solutions run from a point on the outside of a dial, through the centre, to the other side of the dial. Down solutions run from the top dial down through corresponding cells of dials to the bottom dial.

Some seven letter solutions are split into two unconnected words separated by a bar. Their clues are separated by a colon.


Circular solutions may also be split into two or more unconnected words separated by bars. This grid does not show bars. Bars are part of your solution.

The coloured highlights are there just to help the eye move around the grid.

Complete the grid, list the 4 solutions that do not fit and hence solve the mystery. They can be represented in a fanciful eighth dial, but you are advised to ignore this eighth dial.
