Clues are presented in alphabetical order of their solutions.



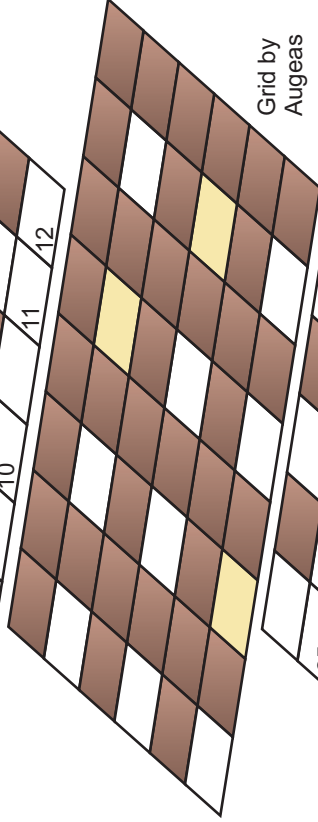
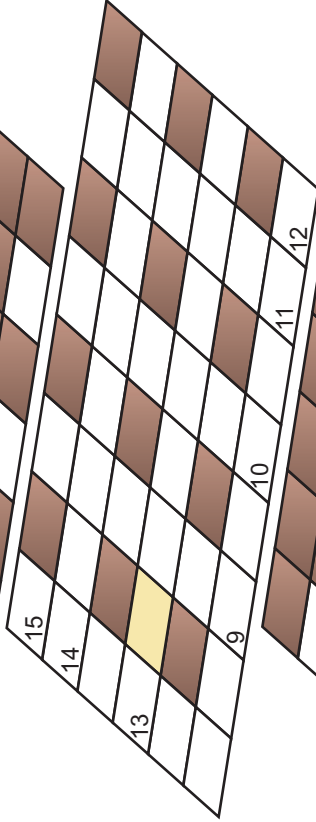
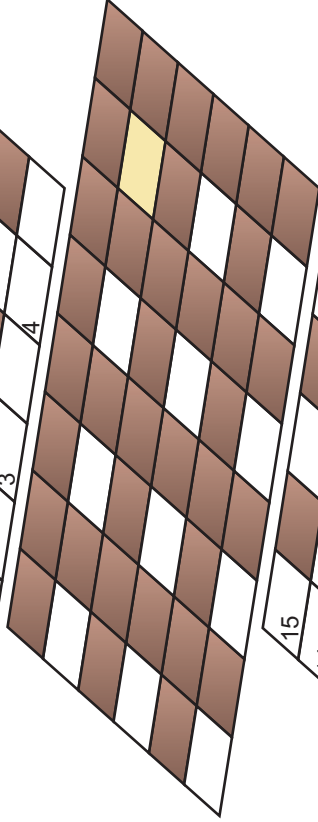
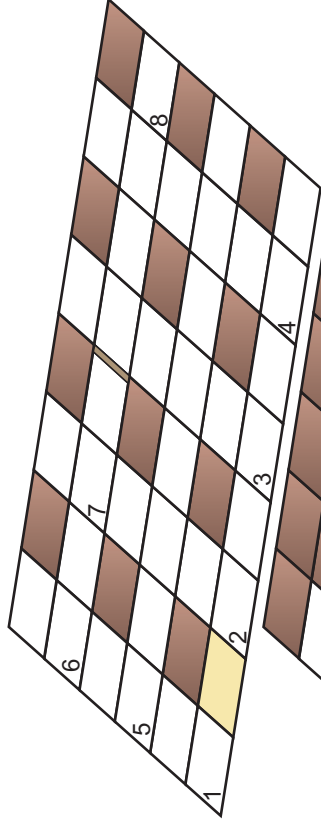
