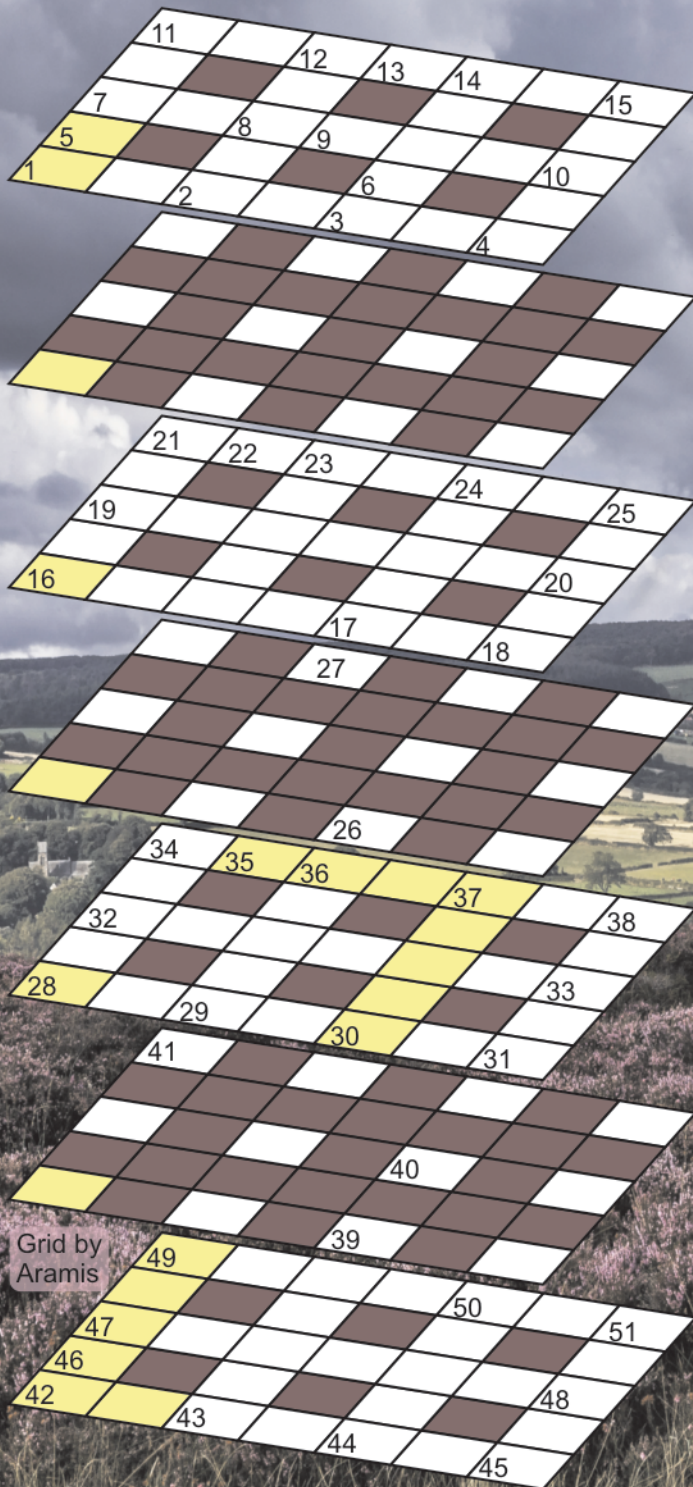


July 2018 Nutmeg Aramis
